## ROTARY'S LOST ALUMNI!

### Who are they?

RI Alumni (105,000 of them) are individuals who have participated in the following RI programs:

- Ambassadorial Scholarship
- Group Study Exchange (GSE)
- Carl P. Miller Discovery Grants
- Rotary grants for university teachers
- Rotary Peace and Conflict Studies Program
- Rotary World Peace Fellowships
- Volunteer Service Grants

*Remember, to be eligible to participate in these programs, a person may NOT be a Rotarian, or even be related to a Rotarian! So, by definition, they are NOT Rotarians. (Even though Youth Exchange Students are technically not "Alumni", we'll include them too!)*

### Why do we want them?

- They should be Rotarians!
- Good resource for meeting programs
- Support the Foundation

### Where are they?

- They could be anywhere
- You may know where they are, but others don't
- Are there any in your community?

### Why aren't they Rotarians?

- They've never been asked
- We don't know where they are

### How do we find them?

- Review master alumni list – anyone there you know? *(The master list will be distributed to all Club Presidents during the first quarter of each year)*
- Article in local newspaper
- Spread the word
