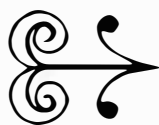

The following statement was issued by **Dr. CARLOS CANESCO** President of Rotary International concerning action by the U.S. Supreme Court in the U.S. Jaycees case involving the admission of women as regular members; and may be useful in responding to queries as to the position of Rotary.

"It is my view that, because Rotary is an organization with the sole purpose of service to others, the issues decided by the supreme court in Roberts vs. United States **Jaycees** are outside the scope of and therefore do not effect the membership policies of Rotary International.

"In summery, Rotary is a **Men's Fellowship** whose purpose is service. It is not a business or public accomodation. By policy it is not political. In addition, Rotary prohibits a member from seeking any business or professional advantage from his membership.



BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING: ARMOUR ANDERSON

July 12th, noon at Mandarin House, JERRY ELLIS had his first Board meeting with new members ED SKINNER, TOM ASHENBRENER and FOGGY FISHER. Treasurer FRANK DELUCA reported the club in solid finances.
