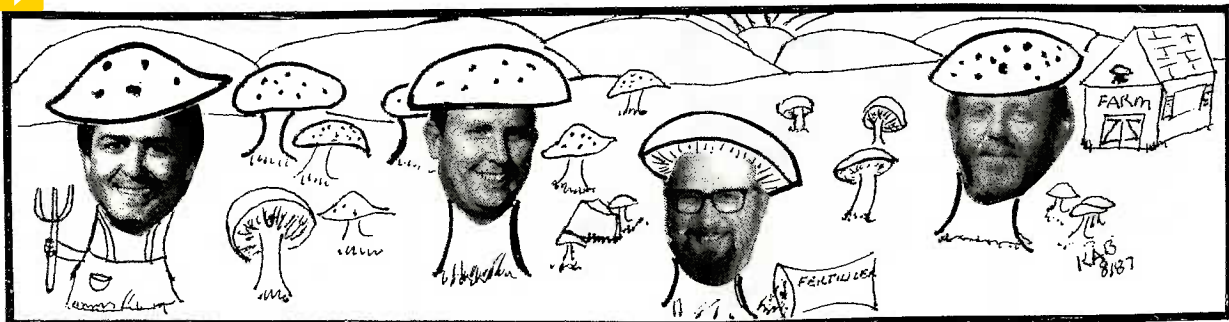
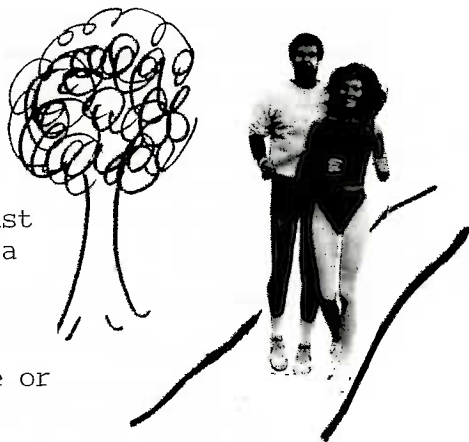
POLIO PLUS: An Attainable Goal

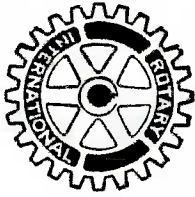
