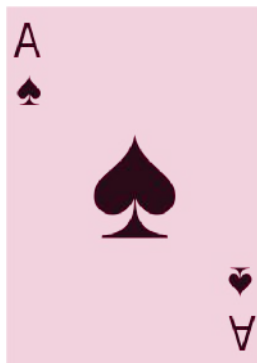

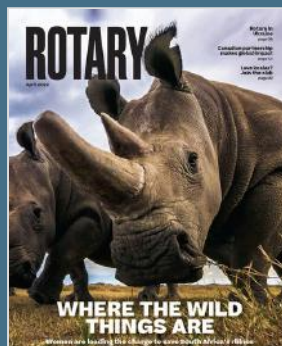


### And Then There Were 4
