Jane Hensheid the winner last fall is going to Finland. This means another \$1500 out of the budget. Again this year we are sponsoring 2 people to go to business week in Boise. The cost is \$150 per person. We are sending a student and a teacher for this one week session at B.S.U. The program has reached the point that they are expecting over 500 students and over 50 teachers.

with John Roper and Charlie Watts becoming sustaining members. Leonard (Foggy) Fisher has become our first voluntary paid up Paul Harris fellow. Congratulations to all of you. There are a list of rotarians that feel the way you do about the foundation.. for instance the club from Murray (mentioned earlier) had approximately 65 members & they are a 1500% club. With this last participation from the 3 members, we are now a 600% club. (Ask Dale Riedesel what this actually means).

Rotary chartered a club in FIFU KANOH, Japan and all 40 chartered members were wearing Paul Harris pins. This was the first time in Rotary history. The new members felt it

would set an example and broaden the international understanding of Rotary Foundation. (This means they gave \$40,000 to the foundation before they ever had their first official meeting).

This month we have given two honorary memberships in our club. The first was to Chick Hayes who was a member in 1926, 55 years ago. Mr. Hayes wrote us a letter on his stationary used in 1924, Hayes Hatchery. He reviewed all the members on that time and because of the depression starting in 1929 he dropped from Rotary. He stated he was \$88 in arrears at the time and sent us a check with the promise to not let this happen again. The 2nd honorary membership went to Walt Priebe...a CHARTER member of the Twin Falls Club. Walt had his 100 birthday, Sat. 23. He came to Twin Falls in 1910. OUR CLUB WAS CHARTERED in 1918 - 63 years ago. Mr. Priebe had a jewelry store and was a watch maker by trade. He was active in public service, such as the city band, and more notably he wa the key to good wildlife and fish management that perserveres to this day. Walt is a living example of "service above self" because he is a rotarian is all that more important. Both these gentlemen were our guests at separate Wed. meetings.
