

ROTARY CLUB IS ORGANIZED IN TWIN FALLS

**TWENTY-FIVE JOIN ACTIVE
ORGANIZATION TO BUILD
UP CITY**

**Will Help Work of
Commercial Club**

**Large Delegation From Twin
Falls Initiates the Movement
and Are Given Banquet Here
on Tuesday Afternoon.**

Twin Falls is now connected with the national, or rather international organization, of Rotary clubs, a city organization having been effected Tuesday afternoon by the selection of the following officers: Judge E. A. Walters, president; W. H. Eldridge, vice president and Stuart H. Taylor, secretary-treasurer. The organization was effected by a committee from Salt Lake City, which established

clubs in Twin Falls, Pocatello and Idaho Falls during their trip.

The purpose of a club of this sort is to build up the community and to supplement, rather than take the place of, the commercial organization. It started about ten years ago in Chicago, purely as a local enterprise, but speedily becoming identified with the good roads movement, it extended into Illinois, then into other states and finally into Canada. That it is a help to rather than a substitute for the commercial club is shown by the fact that President Fred Richardson, of the Salt Lake City Commercial club, was among the organizers who came to this city Tuesday. General Manager George O. Platt of the Oregon Short-Line and George O. Relf, proprietor of the Utah hotel were also in the delegation.

A banquet was tendered the visitors at the Hotel Rogerson on their arrival, and many felicitous addresses made. The new society was launched with a membership of twenty-five and is expected to grow rapidly. The annual election of officers will be held in May.
